

Read this before operating your camcorder

Before operating the unit, please read this Handbook thoroughly, and retain it for future reference.

Notes on use

Your camcorder is supplied with two kinds of operations guides.

For operating and handling the camcorder, refer to "Operating Guide" and "Handycam Handbook" (PDF/this Handbook).

Types of "Memory Stick" you can use in your camcorder

You can use "Memory Stick Duo" marked with Memory Stick Duo or Memory Stick PRO Duo (p. 111).

"Memory Stick Duo" (This size can be used with your camcorder.)



"Memory Stick" (You cannot use it in your camcorder.)




- You cannot use any type of memory card except "Memory Stick Duo."
- "Memory Stick PRO" and "Memory Stick PRO Duo" can be used only with "Memory Stick PRO" compatible equipment.
- Do not attach a label or the like on a "Memory Stick Duo" or a Memory Stick Duo Adaptor.

When using a "Memory Stick Duo" with "Memory Stick" compatible equipment

Be sure to insert the "Memory Stick Duo" into the Memory Stick Duo Adaptor.

On using the camcorder

• Do not hold the camcorder by the following parts.




LCD screen

Battery

- The camcorder is not dustproofed, dripproofed or waterproofed. See "About handling of your camcorder" (p. 114).
- To prevent the hard disk from being broken or recorded images from being lost, do not do the following when either of the respective lamps of the POWER switch (p. 17) or the access lamp (p. 23, 27) is on:
 - to remove the battery pack or AC Adaptor from the camcorder.
 - to apply mechanical shock or vibration to the camcorder.
- Before connecting your camcorder to another device with a USB cable etc., be sure to insert the connector plug in the proper direction. If you insert the connector plug forcibly in the wrong direction, the terminal may be damaged, or this may cause a malfunction of your camcorder.
- Disconnect the AC Adaptor from the Handycam Station holding both the camcorder and the DC plug.
- Be sure to turn the POWER switch to OFF (CHG), when you set the camcorder onto the Handycam Station or remove the camcorder from it.

About menu items, LCD panel and lens

- A menu item that is grayed out is not available under the current recording or playback conditions.
- The LCD screen is manufactured using extremely high-precision technology, so over 99.99% of the pixels are operational for effective use. However, there may be some tiny black points and/or bright points (white, red, blue, or green in color) that appear constantly on the LCD screen. These points are normal results of the manufacturing process and do not affect the recording in any way.



White, red, blue or green point

- Exposing the LCD screen or the lens to direct sunlight for long periods of time may cause malfunctions.
- Do not aim at the sun. Doing so might cause your camcorder to malfunction. Take images of the sun only in low light conditions, such as at dusk.

On recording

- Before starting to record, test the recording function to make sure the image and sound are recorded without any problems.
- Compensation for the contents of recordings cannot be provided, even if recording or playback is not possible due to a malfunction of the camcorder, recording media, etc.
- TV color systems differ depending on the countries/regions. To view your recordings on a TV, you need a NTSC system-based TV.

- Television programs, films, video tapes, and other materials may be copyrighted. Unauthorized recording of such materials may be contrary to the copyright laws.
- You cannot play back both movies and still images other than the images recorded with your camcorder. You also cannot play back images recorded with other DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82/SR200/ SR300.

About language setting

The on-screen displays in each local language are used for illustrating the operating procedures. Change the screen language before using your camcorder if necessary (p. 18).

About this Handbook

- The LCD screens and indicators shown in this Handbook were taken with a digital still camera, and may look different from what you actually see.
- Design and specifications of recording media and other accessories are subject to change without notice.
- Unless otherwise specially indicated, illustrations in this Handbook are based on DCR-SR300.

About the Carl Zeiss lens

Your camcorder is equipped with a Carl Zeiss lens, which was developed jointly by Carl Zeiss, in Germany, and Sony Corporation, and produces superior images. It adopts the MTF measurement system for video cameras and offers a quality typical of a Carl Zeiss lens.

Also, the lens for DCR-SR200/SR300 is T*-coated to suppress unwanted reflections, then faithfully reproduce colors.

MTF = Modulation Transfer Function. The number value indicates the amount of light from a subject coming into the lens.

Notes on using the Hard Disk Drive Handycam

Save all your recorded image data

- · To prevent your image data from being lost, save all your recorded images on external media. It is recommended that you save the image data on a disc such as DVD-R using your computer (p. 77). Also, you can save your image data using a VCR, or a DVD/HDD recorder (p. 45).
- · It is recommended that you save your image data periodically, after recording.

Do not apply shock or vibration to your camcorder

- · The hard disk of the camcorder may not be recognized, or recording or playback may not be possible.
- · Especially, during recording/playback, do not apply shock. After recording, do not apply vibration or shock to the camcorder, while the ACCESS lamp is lit.
- · When using the shoulder belt (not supplied), do not crash the camera against an object.

On the drop sensor

 To protect the internal hard disk from the shock by dropping, the camcorder has the drop sensor function (p. 64). When a drop occurs, or under a non-gravity condition, the block noise to protect the camcorder may also be recorded. If the drop sensor catches a drop repeatedly, recording/ playback may be stopped.

Notes on battery pack/AC Adaptor

- · While the ACCESS lamp is lit, be sure to avoid the following. They may cause malfunctions.
 - Removing the battery pack
 - Removing the AC Adaptor (while charging the battery pack using the AC Adaptor)
- · Be sure to remove the battery pack or the AC Adaptor after turning off the POWER switch.

Note on operating temperatures

· When the temperature of the camcorder becomes extremely high or extremely low, you may not be able to record or play back on the camcorder, due to the protection features of the camcorder being activated in such situations. In this case, a message appears on the LCD screen (p. 104).

When the camcorder is connected to a computer

· Do not try to format the hard disk of the camcorder using a computer. If you do so, your camcorder may not operate correctly.

Note on using the camcorder at high altitudes

· Do not turn on the camcorder in a low-pressure area, where the altitude is more than 3,000 meters (9,800 feet). Doing so may damage the hard disk drive of your camcorder.

Note on disposal/transfer

 If you perform [O FORMAT] (p.49) or formatting the hard disk of the camcorder, you may not delete data from the hard disk completely. When you transfer the camcorder, it is recommended that you perform [O EMPTY] (p.51) to prevent the recovery of your data.

In addition to the above, when you dispose of the camcorder, it is recommended that you destroy the actual body of the camcorder.

If you cannot record/play back images, perform [\bigcirc FORMAT]

 If you repeat recording/deleting images for a long time, fragmentation of data occurs on the hard disk. Images cannot be saved or recorded. In such a case, save your images on some type of external media first (p. 37), and then perform [FORMAT] (p. 49).

Using the HOME MENU

1 While pressing the green button in the center, turn the POWER switch in the direction of the arrow to turn on the power.



2 Press **f** (HOME) A (or B).



3 Touch the desired category.

Example: 🚍 (OTHERS) category



4 Touch the desired item.

Example: [EDIT]



5 Follow the guide on the screen for further operation.

To hide the HOME MENU screen Touch $\boxed{\times}$.

When you want to know something about the function of each item on the HOME MENU - HELP

1 Press 🏫 (HOME).

The HOME MENU appears.



2 Touch ? (HELP).

The bottom of the ? (HELP) button turns orange.



3 Touch the item you want to know the content.



When you touch an item, its explanation appears on the screen.

To apply the option, touch [YES], otherwise, touch [NO].

To deactivate the HELP

Touch ? (HELP) again in step 2.

Using the OPTION MENU

Just a touch on the screen during shooting or playback displays the functions available at that moment. You will find it easy to make various settings. See page 65 for further details.





Step 2: Charging the battery pack



You can charge the "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack (H series) (p. 112) after attaching it to your camcorder.

Ø Notes

- Your camcorder operates only with an "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack (H series).
- 1 Attach the battery pack by sliding it in the direction of the arrow until it clicks.
- 2 Turn the POWER switch in the direction of the arrow to OFF (CHG) (The default setting).

3 Connect the AC Adaptor to the DC IN jack on the Handycam Station.

Be sure that the \blacktriangle mark on the DC plug is facing up.

4 Connect the power cord to the AC Adaptor and the wall outlet.

5 Set the camcorder onto the Handycam Station securely.


The CHG (charge) lamp lights up and charging starts.

The CHG (charge) lamp turns off when the battery pack is fully charged.

• When setting the camcorder onto the Handycam Station, close the DC IN jack cover.

To charge the battery pack using only the AC Adaptor

Turn the POWER switch to OFF (CHG), then connect the AC Adaptor directly to the DC IN jack on the camcorder.




To the wall outlet

Ø Notes

• Disconnect the AC Adaptor from the DC IN jack holding both the camcorder and the DC plug.

To remove the battery pack

Turn the POWER switch to OFF (CHG). Slide the BATT (battery) release lever and remove the battery pack.




Ø Notes

• When you remove the battery pack or the AC Adaptor, make sure that the H (Movie) lamp/ (Still) lamp (p. 23) is turned off.

To remove your camcorder from the Handycam Station

Turn off the power, then remove the camcorder from the Handycam Station holding both.



When storing the battery pack


Fully discharge the battery before storing it for an extended period (see page 113 for the details of storage).

To use an outside power source


Make the same connections as you do when charging the battery pack. The battery pack will not lose its charge in this case.

To check the remaining battery (Battery Info)

Set the POWER switch to OFF (CHG), then press DISP/BATT INFO.



After a while, the approximate recordable time and battery information appear for about 7 seconds. You can view the battery information for up to 20 seconds by pressing DISP/BATT INFO again while the information is displayed. Remaining battery (approx.)

On the battery pack

- Before changing the battery pack, turn the POWER switch to OFF (CHG) and turn off the (Movie) lamp/ (Still) lamp (p. 23).
- The CHG (charge) lamp flashes during charging, or Battery Info (p. 14) will not be correctly displayed under the following conditions:
 - The battery pack is not attached correctly.
 - The battery pack is damaged.
 - The battery pack is worn-out (For Battery Info only).
- The power will not be supplied from the battery as long as the AC Adaptor is connected to the DC IN jack of your camcorder or the Handycam Station, even when the power cord is disconnected from the wall outlet.
- When attaching an optional video light, it is recommended that you use an NP-FH70/FH100 battery pack (except for DCR-SR42).
- We do not recommend using an NP-FH30, which only allows short recording and playback times, with your camcorder.

On the charging/recording/playback time


- Times measured when using the camcorder at 25 °C (77 °F) (10 °C to 30 °C (50 °F to 86 °F) is recommended).
- The available recording and playback time will be shorter when you use your camcorder in low temperatures.
- The available recording and playback time will be shorter depending on the conditions under which you use your camcorder.

On the AC Adaptor

- Use the nearby wall outlet when using the AC Adaptor. Disconnect the AC Adaptor from the wall outlet immediately if any malfunction occurs while using your camcorder.
- Do not use the AC Adaptor placed in a narrow space, such as between a wall and furniture.
- Do not short-circuit the DC plug of the AC Adaptor or battery terminal with any metallic objects. This may cause a malfunction.
- Even if your camcorder is turned off, AC power (house current) is still supplied to it while connected to the wall outlet via the AC Adaptor.

Step 3: Turning the power on, and setting the date and time

Set the date and time when using this camcorder for the first time. If you do not set the date and time, the [CLOCK SET] screen appears every time you turn on your camcorder or change the POWER switch position.



- **1** While pressing the green button, turn the POWER switch repeatedly in the direction of the arrow until the respective lamp lights up.
 - (Movie): To record movies
 - **(Still):** To record still images
 - The [CLOCK SET] screen appears.



2 Select the desired geographical area with ▲/▼, then touch [NEXT].

3 Set [DST SET] or [SUMMERTIME], then touch [NEXT].

4 Set [Y] (year) with ▲/▼.



5 Select [M] with ◄/►, then set the month with ▲/▼.

6 Set [D] (day), hour and minute in the same way, then touch [NEXT].

7 Make sure that the clock is correctly set, then touch OK.

The clock starts.

You can set any year up to the year 2037.

For midnight, set it to 12:00 AM. For midday, set it to 12:00 PM.

To turn off the power

Turn the POWER switch to OFF (CHG).

To reset the date and time

Touch \uparrow (HOME) $\rightarrow \bigoplus$ (SETTINGS) \rightarrow [CLOCK/[LANG] \rightarrow [CLOCK SET], and set the date and time.

Ø Notes

- If you do not use your camcorder for about 3 months, the built-in rechargeable battery gets discharged and the date and time settings may be cleared from the memory. In that case, charge the built-in rechargeable battery and then set the date and time again (p. 116).
- It takes a few seconds for your camcorder to be ready to shoot after the power is turned on. You cannot operate your camcorder during this time.
- The lens cover opens automatically when the power is turned on (DCR-SR200/SR300). It closes when the playback screen is selected, or the power is turned off.
- In the setting at the time of purchase, the power turns off automatically if you leave your camcorder without any operation attempted for approximately 5 minutes, to save battery power ([A.SHUT OFF], p. 64).

ີ່ 🏹 Tips

- The date and time does not appear during recording, but they are automatically recorded on the hard disk, and can be displayed during playback ([DATA CODE], p. 60).
- Refer to page 109 for information concerning "World time difference."
- If the buttons on the touch panel do not work correctly, adjust the touch panel (CALIBRATION) (p. 115).


Changing the language setting

You can change the on-screen displays to show messages in a specified language. Touch \uparrow (HOME) \rightarrow \bigoplus (SETTINGS) \rightarrow [CLOCK/ \square LANG] \rightarrow [\square LANGUAGE SET], then select the desired language.

Step 4: Preparing for recording

Opening the lens cover manually (DCR-SR42/SR62/ SR82)

Slide the lens cover switch to open.




ΰTips

- · When you finish recording or when you playback images, close the lens cover.
- · For DCR-SR200/SR300, the lens cover opens and closes automatically.

Adjusting the LCD panel

Open the LCD panel 90 degrees to the camcorder (1), then rotate it to the best angle to record or play (2).



2180 degrees (max.)

190 degrees to the camcorder

To turn off the LCD backlight to make the battery last longer (except for DCR-SR42)

Press and hold DISP/BATT INFO for a few seconds until \Box_{OFF} appears.

This setting is practical when you use your camcorder in bright conditions or when you want to save battery power. The recorded image will not be affected by the setting. To turn on the LCD backlight, press and hold DISP/BATT INFO for a few seconds until \Box_{FF} disappears.

() Notes


· Do not press the buttons on the LCD frame accidentally when you open or adjust the LCD panel.

ϔ Tips

- If you open the LCD panel 90 degrees to the camcorder, then rotate it 180 degrees to the lens side, you can close the LCD panel with the LCD screen facing out. This is convenient during playback operations.
- Touch \uparrow (HOME) $\rightarrow \Box$ (SETTINGS) \rightarrow $[SOUND/DISP SET] \rightarrow [LCD BRIGHT]$ (p. 61), and adjust the brightness of the LCD screen.
- · The information is displayed or hidden (display ↔ no display) each time you press DISP/ BATT INFO.

Fastening the grip belt


Fasten the grip belt and hold your camcorder correctly.





Easy Handycam operation makes nearly all settings automatic so that you can perform recording or playback operation without detailed settings. It also makes screen font size larger for easy viewing.









Open the lens cover (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82) (p. 19)

Recording movies



3 Press START/STOP H (or E) to start recording.*



To stop recording, press START/STOP again.

If the POWER switch is set to OFF (CHG), turn it while pressing the green button.

Recording still images

Still images are recorded on the hard disk in the default setting. You can change the recording media of still images to a "Memory Stick Duo" (p. 27).

Turn the POWER switch G until the D (Still) lamp lights up.







Playing back recorded movies/still images

1 Turn the POWER switch **G** to turn on your camcorder.

2 Press ▶ (VIEW IMAGES) 1 (or D) button

The VISUAL INDEX screen appears on the LCD screen. (It may take some time to display the thumbnails.)




- ② 1 :Displays still images on the hard disk.

3 Start playback.

Movies:

Touch the **tab** and the movie to be played back.



* The setting of [DATA CODE] is fixed to [DATE/TIME] (p. 60).

ີ່ 🏹 Tips

- When playback from the selected movie reaches the last movie, the screen returns to the VISUAL INDEX screen.
- You can slow down the playback speed by touching \blacksquare / \blacksquare during pause.
- You can adjust volume by selecting \uparrow (HOME) $\rightarrow \Xi$ (SETTINGS) \rightarrow [SOUND SETTINGS] \rightarrow [VOLUME], then with -//+.

To cancel Easy Handycam operation

Press EASY A again. Asy disappears from the LCD screen.

Menu settings during Easy Handycam operation

Press \bigstar (HOME) \bigcirc (or B) to display the menu items available for setup changes (p. 9, 53).


Ø Notes

- Most of the menu items automatically return to the default settings. The settings of some menu items are fixed. For details, see page 95.
- You cannot use (OPTION) menu.
- Cancel Easy Handycam operation if you want to add effects to images or change settings.

Invalid buttons during Easy Handycam operation

You cannot use some buttons/functions during Easy Handycam operation since they are automatically set (p. 95). If you set an invalid operation, [Invalid during Easy Handycam operation] may appears.

Recording



Ø Notes

- If the ACCESS lamp is lit or flashing after recording is finished, it means data is still being written onto the hard disk or "Memory Stick Duo." Do not apply shock or vibration to your camcorder, and do not remove the battery or AC Adaptor.
- The maximum continuous recordable time is approximately 13 hours.
- When a movie file exceeds 2 GB, the next movie file is created automatically.

You can check the free hard disk space by touching ↑ (HOME) → ⓑ (MANAGE HDD/MEMORY) → [○ INFO] (p. 50).





- 1 Turn the POWER switch A until the **()** (Still) lamp lights up.
- 2 Press PHOTO F lightly to adjust the focus (a beep sounds), then press it fully () (a shutter click sounds).



When **WHE** disappears, the image has been recorded.

To switch the shooting mode using the \clubsuit (HOME) D (or E) button

On the HOME MENU, touch $(CAMERA) \rightarrow [MOVIE]$ or [PHOTO].







Capturing high quality still images during movie recording (Dual Rec) (DCR-SR200/SR300)


You can capture high quality still images while recording a movie on the hard disk.



① Turn the POWER switch until the (Movie) lamp lights up, then press START/ STOP to start movie recording.

Press PHOTO fully.

After you start recording, and before you finish, you can capture up to 3 frames of still images from your movie.



Orange color boxes indicate the number of captured images. When capturing is finished, the color changes to orange.

③ Press START/STOP to stop movie recording.

Captured still images appear one by one, and the images are recorded. When **IIIIII** disappears, the image has been recorded.

Ø Notes

- When you record still images on a "Memory Stick Duo," do not eject the "Memory Stick Duo" before recording a movie is finished and the still images are recorded on it.

Recording still images on a "Memory Stick Duo"

Recording the fast action in slow-motion (SMTH SLW REC) (DCR-SR200/SR300)

Fast moving subjects and actions, which cannot be captured under the ordinary shooting conditions, can be shot in smooth moving slow-motion for about 3 seconds. This is useful to shoot fast actions such as a golf or tennis swing.



- ① Turn the POWER switch to turn on the camcorder.
- Press (HOME) A (or B) to display the HOME MENU.
- ③ Touch (CAMERA).
- (4) Touch [SMTH SLW REC].



⑤ Press START/STOP.

The Handycam Station and your camcorder are both equipped with A/V OUT jacks (p. 120, 121). Connect the A/V connecting cable either to the Handycam Station or to your camcorder, according to your setup.

2 A/V connecting cable with S VIDEO (optional)

When connecting to another device via the S VIDEO jack, by using an A/V connecting cable with an S VIDEO cable (optional), higher quality images can be produced than with an A/V connecting cable. Connect the white and red plug (left/right audio) and the S VIDEO plug (S VIDEO channel) of the A/V connecting cable with an S VIDEO cable (optional). The yellow plug connection is not necessary. S VIDEO connection only will not output audio.

Ø Notes

• Do not connect A/V connecting cables to both your camcorder and the Handycam Station at the same time. The image might get disturbed.

When your TV is connected to a VCR

To set the aspect ratio according to the connected TV (16:9/4:3)

Change the setting according to the screen aspect ratio of the TV you will view images on.



• When you play back an image recorded in 16:9 (wide) aspect ratio on a 4:3 TV not compatible with the 16:9 (wide) signal, set [TV TYPE] to [4:3].



When your TV is monaural (When your TV has only one audio input jack)

Connect the yellow plug of the A/V connecting cable to the video input jack and connect the white (left channel) or red (right channel) plug to the audio input jack of your TV or VCR. When you want to play the sound in monaural mode, use a connecting cable for that purpose.

Saving images

Recorded images are stored on the internal hard disk of your camcorder. Due to the limited capacity of the internal hard disk, make sure that you save the image data to some type of external media such as a DVD-R or a computer.

You can save the images recorded on the camcorder as described below.

Saving images using a computer

By using the software on the supplied CD-ROM, you can save images on a DVD or the hard disk of a computer.

For details on the DVDs compatible with your computer, refer to the operations manual supplied with your computer. You may not be able to play back some types of DVDs, depending on the device you have. Refer to the specifications of your playback equipment for additional compatibility information.

- When saving data on a DVD+RW, the data is recorded in VIDEO format. You cannot add more data on the DVD+RW.
- Use a DVD produced by a reliable manufacturer. You may not save images correctly when using a low quality DVD.

Saving images on a DVD with One Touch (One Touch Disc Burn)

You can save images recorded on the hard disk of your camcorder on a DVD in your computer by pressing DISC BURN button on the Handycam Station (One Touch Disc Burn function) without any complex operations on your computer. The images that have not yet been saved on a DVD with One Touch Disc Burn can automatically be saved on a DVD.

ີ່ 🏹 Tips

- The image data previously saved on a DVD in this operation cannot be saved again with the same operation. To save data on a DVD again after it has been saved previously, import the images to a computer (p. 81). Then, save the data on a DVD, following the instructions in "Creating and copying a DVD" (p. 90).
- The history of each saved image is recorded according to the user account. If you use a different user account, the image that has already been saved to a DVD is written to the DVD again.







Editing still images

You can edit imported still images as follows. For details about the operation, refer to the Picture Motion Browser Help.

Automatic Correction

Automatically corrects the brightness and contrast to the most suitable levels for that image.

Correcting brightness and contrast

The brightness and contrast of still images can be corrected. You can also correct only dark or light areas.

Correcting saturation

Adjusts the saturation of images.

Adjusting sharpness

Emphasizes the outline of images.

Adjusting with the tone curve

The histogram and tone curve for the channel being displayed in the dropdown list are shown. You can adjust the tone curve for each channel.

Red-eye Reduction

If the red-eye is caused by shooting a person with flash, you can correct the red-eye portion of the still image. You can correct and remove the red-eye portion of still images.

Trimming

You can edit still images and use only the parts of the image you want.

Resizing

You can resize still images and save them to the desired folder.

Changing the date and time stamp

You can change the date and time stamp of still images in a batch.

Inserting date

You can insert a date stamp into still images.

You can create a DVD Video with a DVD menu by putting images on your computer as materials.

Copying a DVD

You can copy the images recorded on a DVD to another DVD.

You can also back up a DVD.

This procedure describes how to copy the images recorded on a DVD-RW (12 cm) to a DVD-R (12 cm) in the DVD drive of your computer.

1 Turn on the computer.

2 Insert a recorded DVD into the DVD drive of your computer.

3 Click [Start] → [All Programs] (for Windows 2000, click [Programs]) → [Sony Picture Utility] → [Video Disc Copier] on your computer.

Disc copy window is displayed.



4 Select a DVD drive for [Source:] and [Copy to:].

The status of the drive and DVD is displayed. Depending on the status, copying cannot start. Follow the instruction to change the DVD.

Obtaining information from a DVD of your computer takes time. Wait until the DVD information is displayed in the window.

5 When preparations for copying are completed, click [Start].

DVD copy starts.

ີ່ 🏹 Tips

 You can choose to create more copies of the same DVD after writing to the DVD is completed.

To change the location for temporary files and the writing speed

On the Disc copy window, click [Settings]. Select [Manually select a writing speed before writing to the disc] and click [OK] to specify the writing speed each time, before writing starts.

ີ່ 🏹 Tips

 Depending on the capacity of the source DVD, the free space required on your hard disk for temporary files varies.

Manipulating still images

You can manipulate imported still images as follows. For details about the operation, refer to the Picture Motion Browser Help.

Printing still images

You can print imported still images. You can also print still images with the date information.

🏹 Tips

• You can save a scene you select from the movie as a still image and print it.

Sending still images by e-mail

You can start your e-mail software, attach still images to e-mail and send them via email.

- MAPI must be enabled in your e-mail software for this feature to work. Refer to the user manual or help files of your e-mail software for more information about MAPI.
- · Movie data files cannot be sent by e-mail.

Opening with external applications

You can start a commercially available application via Picture Motion Browser and view images with these applications.

Notes before sending your camcorder for repair

- Your camcorder may be required to initialize or change the current hard disk of the camcorder, depending on the problem. In the event of this, the data stored on the hard disk will be deleted. Be sure to save the data on the internal hard disk (p. 37) on other media (backup) before sending your camcorder for repair. We will not compensate you for any loss of hard disk data.
- During repair, we may check a minimum amount of data stored on the hard disk in order to investigate the problem. However, your Sony dealer will neither copy nor retain your data.

Overall operations/Easy Handycam operation/Remote Commander

The power does not turn on.

- Attach a charged battery pack to the camcorder (p. 13).
- Connect the plug of the AC Adaptor to the wall outlet (p. 13).
- Set the camcorder onto the Handycam Station securely (p. 13).

The camcorder does not operate even when the power is set to on.

- It takes a few seconds for your camcorder to be ready to shoot after the power is turned on. This is not a malfunction.
- Disconnect the AC Adaptor from the wall outlet or remove the battery pack, then reconnect it after about 1 minute. If the functions still do not work, press the RESET button (p. 119) using a sharppointed object. (If you press the RESET button, all settings, including the clock setting, are reset.)
- The temperature of your camcorder is extremely high. Turn off your camcorder and leave it for a while in a cool place.
- The temperature of your camcorder is extremely low. Turn off the camcorder and take it to a warm place. Leave the camcorder there for a while, then turn on the camcorder.

Buttons do not work.

- During Easy Handycam operation, the following buttons/functions are not available.
 - BACK LIGHT button (p. 28)
 - Playback zoom (p. 33)
 - To turn on and off the LCD backlight (Pressing and holding the DISP/BATT INFO button for a few seconds) (p. 19)

The **G**=(OPTION) button is not displayed.

 The OPTION MENU cannot be used during Easy Handycam operation.

The menu settings have changed automatically.

- During Easy Handycam operation, nearly all the menu items will be automatically set to the default settings.
- During Easy Handycam operation, some menu items are fixed as follows.

Your camcorder gets warm.

• This is because the power has been turned on for a long time. This is not a malfunction.

The supplied Remote Commander does not function (except for DCR-SR42).

- Set [REMOTE CTRL] to [ON] (p. 64).
- Insert a battery into the battery holder with the +/– polarities correctly matching the +/ – marks (p. 122).
- Remove any obstructions between the Remote Commander and the remote sensor.
- Point the remote sensor away from strong light sources such as direct sunlight or overhead lighting. Otherwise, the Remote Commander may not function properly.

Another DVD device malfunctions when you use the supplied Remote Commander (except for DCR-SR42).

 Select a commander mode other than DVD 2 for your DVD device, or cover the sensor of your DVD device with black paper.

Batteries/Power sources

The power abruptly turns off.

- When approximately 5 minutes have elapsed while you do not operate your camcorder, the camcorder is automatically turned off (A.SHUT OFF). Change the setting of [A.SHUT OFF] (p. 64), or turn on the power again, or use the AC Adaptor.
- Charge the battery pack (p. 13).

The CHG (charge) lamp does not light while the battery pack is being charged.

- Turn the POWER switch to OFF (CHG) (p. 13).
- Attach the battery pack to the camcorder correctly (p. 13).
- Connect the power cord to the wall outlet properly.
- The battery charge is completed (p. 13).
- Set the camcorder onto the Handycam Station securely (p. 13).

The CHG (charge) lamp flashes while the battery pack is being charged.

• Attach the battery pack to the camcorder correctly (p. 13). If the problem persists, disconnect the AC Adaptor from the wall outlet and contact your Sony dealer. The battery pack may be damaged.

The remaining battery time indicator does not indicate the correct time.

- The temperature of the environment is too high or too low. This is not a malfunction.
- The battery pack has not been charged enough. Fully charge the battery again. If the problem persists, replace the battery pack with a new one (p. 13).
- The indicated time may not be correct depending on the environment of use.

The battery pack is quickly discharged.

- The temperature of the environment is too high or low. This is not a malfunction.
- The battery pack has not been charged enough. Fully charge the battery again. If the problem persists, replace the battery pack with a new one (p. 13).

LCD screen

The buttons do not appear on the touch panel.

- Touch the LCD screen lightly.
- Press DISP/BATT INFO on your camcorder (or DISPLAY on the Remote Commander (except for DCR-SR42)) (p. 19).

The buttons on the touch panel do not work correctly or do not work at all.

• Adjust the touch panel ([CALIBRATION]) (p. 115).

Menu items are grayed out.

- You cannot select grayed items in the current recording/playback situation.
- There are some functions you cannot activate simultaneously (p. 102).

"Memory Stick Duo"

You cannot operate functions using the "Memory Stick Duo."

• If you use a "Memory Stick Duo" formatted on a computer, format it again on your camcorder (p. 50).

You cannot delete images stored on or format the "Memory Stick Duo."

- The maximum number of still images that you can delete on the index screen at one time is 100.
- You cannot delete still images that have write-protection set by another device.

The data file name is not indicated correctly or flashes.

- · The file is damaged.
- The file format is not supported by your camcorder (p. 111). Use the supported file format.

Recording

Refer also to "Memory Stick Duo" (p. 96).

Pressing START/STOP or PHOTO does not record images.

- The playback screen is displayed. Set your camcorder to recording standby (p. 24).
- Your camcorder is recording the image you have just shot on the hard disk. You cannot make new recording during this period (p. 24).
- The hard disk of the camcorder is full. Delete unnecessary images (p. 38).
- Total number of movies or still images exceeds the recordable capacity of your camcorder (p. 57, 110). Delete unnecessary images (p. 38).
- While activating [DROP SENSOR] (p. 64), you may not record images.
- The temperature of your camcorder is extremely high. Turn off your camcorder and leave it for a while in a cool place.
- The temperature of your camcorder is extremely low. Turn off the camcorder and take it to a warm place. Leave the camcorder there for a while, then turn on the camcorder.

You cannot record a still image.

- The playback screen is displayed. Set your camcorder to recording standby (p. 24).
- You can capture up to 3 still images only during movie recording (DCR-SR200/ SR300).
- The "Memory Stick Duo" has run out of space. Use a new "Memory Stick Duo" or format the "Memory Stick Duo" (p. 50). Or delete the unnecessary images (p. 39).
- You cannot record a still image together with:
 - [SMTH SLW REC] (DCR-SR200/ SR300)
 - [FADER]
 - [D.EFFECT]
 - [PICT.EFFECT]

The ACCESS lamp remains lit even when you stop recording.

• Your camcorder is recording the image you have just shot on the hard disk.

The recording angle looks different.

• Recording angle may vary depending on the condition of the camcorder. This is not a malfunction.

The flash does not work (except for DCR-SR42).

- You cannot record with the flash with:
 Capturing still images while recording a movie
 - The conversion lens (optional) attached
- Even if auto flash or ((Auto redeye reduction) is selected, you cannot use the flash with:
 - NightShot
 - [SUPER NIGHTSHOT]
 - [TWILIGHT], [CANDLE],
 [SUNRIZE&SUNSET],
 [FIREWORKS], [LANDSCAPE],
 [SPOTLIGHT], [BEACH] or [SNOW]
 in [SCENE SELECTION]
 - [MANUAL] in [EXPOSURE]
 - [SPOT METER]

The actual recording time for movie is less than the expected approximate recording time of the hard disk.

• Depending on an object, such as a fast moving object, the time available for recording may shorten (p. 54).

The recording stops.

- The temperature of your camcorder is extremely high. Turn off your camcorder and leave it for a while in a cool place.
- The temperature of your camcorder is extremely low. Turn off the camcorder and take it to a warm place. Leave the camcorder there for a while, then turn on the camcorder.
- If you keep applying vibration on the camcorder, recording may stop.

There is a time difference between the point where you press START/ STOP and the point that the recorded movie starts/stops.

• On your camcorder, there may be a slight time difference between the point where you press START/STOP and the actual point that recording movie starts/stops. This is not a malfunction.

The auto focus does not function.

- Set [FOCUS] to [AUTO] (p. 67).
- The recording conditions are not suitable for auto focus. Adjust the focus manually (p. 67).

[STEADYSHOT] does not function.

- Set [STEADYSHOT] to [ON] (p. 55).
- [STEADYSHOT] may not be able to compensate for excessive vibrations.

The BACK LIGHT function does not function.

• The BACK LIGHT function cannot be used during Easy Handycam operation.

The subjects passing by the frame very fast appear crooked (DCR-SR200/SR300).

 This is called the focal plane phenomenon. This is not a malfunction. Because of the way the image device (CMOS sensor) reads out image signals, the subjects passing by the frame rapidly might appear crooked depending on the recording conditions.

Tiny spots in white, red, blue, or green appear on the screen.

 The spots appear when you are recording with [S. NIGHTSHOT PLS] (DCR-SR42/ SR62/SR82), [SUPER NIGHTSHOT] (DCR-SR200/SR300) or [COLOR SLOW SHTR]. This is not a malfunction.

The color of the image is not correctly displayed.

 Set the NIGHTSHOT PLUS switch (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82) or NIGHTSHOT switch (DCR-SR200/SR300) to OFF (p. 27).

The screen image is bright, and the subject does not appear on the screen.

 Set the NIGHTSHOT PLUS switch (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82) or NIGHTSHOT switch (DCR-SR200/SR300) to OFF (p. 27).

The screen image is dark, and the subject does not appear on the screen.

• Press and hold DISP/BATT INFO for a few seconds to turn on the backlight (p. 19).

Troubleshooting

A vertical band appears when recording candlelight or electric light in the dark (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82).

• This occurs when the contrast between the subject and the background is too high. This is not a malfunction.

Horizontal stripes appear on the image (DCR-SR200/SR300).

 This occurs when recording images under a fluorescent lamp, sodium lamp, or mercury lamp. This is not a malfunction.

A vertical white line may appear on an image taken in bright light (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82).

• This phenomenon is called the smear effect. This is not a malfunction.

Undesirable flicker occurs (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82).

• This occurs when recording images under a fluorescent lamp, sodium lamp, or mercury lamp. This is not a malfunction.

Black bands appear when you record a TV screen or computer screen (except for DCR-SR300).

• Set [STEADYSHOT] to [OFF] (p. 55).

[S. NIGHTSHOT PLS] cannot be operated (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82).

• Set the NIGHTSHOT PLUS switch to ON.

[SUPER NIGHTSHOT] cannot be operated (DCR-SR200/SR300).

• Set the NIGHTSHOT switch to ON.

[COLOR SLOW SHTR] does not operate correctly.

 [COLOR SLOW SHTR] may not operate correctly in total darkness. Use NightShot plus or [S. NIGHTSHOT PLS] (DCR-SR42/SR62/SR82), NightShot or [SUPER NIGHTSHOT] (DCR-SR200/SR300).

You cannot adjust [LCD BL LEVEL].

- You cannot adjust [LCD BL LEVEL] when:
 - The LCD panel is closed on your camcorder with the LCD screen facing out.
 - The power is supplied from the AC Adaptor.

Playing back images on your camcorder

Still images stored on a "Memory Stick Duo" cannot be played back.

- Still images cannot be played back if you have modified files or folders, or have edited the data on a computer. (The file name flashes in that case.) This is not a malfunction (p. 112).
- Still images recorded by other devices may not be played back, or appeared in the actual size. This is not a malfunction (p. 112).

"?" is indicated on an image in the VISUAL INDEX screen.

- Loading of the data may have failed. It may be indicated correctly when you turn off the power and then turn it on again, or repeat removing and inserting the "Memory Stick Duo" a couple of times.
- This may appear on still images recorded by other devices, edited on a computer, etc.

No sound or only a quiet sound is heard during playback.

- Turn up the volume (p. 32).
- Sound is not output when the LCD panel is closed. Open the LCD panel.
- When you record sound with [MICREF LEVEL] (p. 71) set to [LOW], the recorded sound may be difficult to hear.
- In case of [SMTH SLW REC], you cannot record sounds during shooting (about 3 seconds) (DCR-SR200/SR300).

Editing images on your camcorder

Unable to edit.

- · There are no images recorded.
- Unable to edit because of the condition of the image.

Movies cannot be added in the Playlist.

- The hard disk is full, or the added movies exceed 99. Erase unnecessary movies (p. 43).
- · You cannot add still images in the Playlist.

A movie cannot be divided.

- A movie that is too short cannot be divided.
- A movie protected on another device cannot be divided.

Unable to copy the images from the hard disk to a "Memory Stick Duo."

• You cannot copy a movie from the hard disk to a "Memory Stick Duo" as a still image during playback on your camcorder.

Dubbing/Connecting to other devices

You cannot hear the sound.

• The audio will not be output when you connect a device via the S VIDEO plug only. Connect the white and red plugs of the A/V connecting cable, too (p. 35).

The aspect ratio of the playback is not correct when connecting your camcorder to the TV.

• Set [TV TYPE] depending on your TV (p. 62).

You cannot dub correctly using the A/V connecting cable.

• The A/V connecting cable is not connected properly. Make sure that the A/V connecting cable is connected to the proper jack, i.e. to the input jack of another device for dubbing a image from your camcorder (p. 45).

Connecting to a computer

The computer does not recognize your camcorder.

- Install Picture Motion Browser (p. 75).
- Disconnect the USB device other than the keyboard, the mouse, and the camcorder from the computer.
- Disconnect the cable from the computer and the Handycam Station, restart the computer, then connect them again correctly.
- Check if Media Check Tool is running on the computer. For details on Media Check Tool, refer to the Help for Picture Motion Browser.

Troubleshooting

Cannot use the supplied software, Picture Motion Browser, on the Macintosh computer.

• You cannot use Picture Motion Browser on a Macintosh.

The One Touch Disc Burn function does not work.

- Install Picture Motion Browser (p. 75).
- Check if Media Check Tool is running on the computer. For details on Media Check Tool, refer to the Help for Picture Motion Browser.

You cannot view the images recorded on your camcorder with a computer.

- Make sure you insert the connector in the correct direction, then connect the USB cable to the ψ (USB) jack on the Handycam Station and the computer firmly.
- Touch \bigoplus (OTHERS) \rightarrow [COMPUTER] \rightarrow [\bigoplus COMPUTER] on the HOME MENU of the camcorder (p. 81).
- Disconnect the USB device other than the keyboard, the mouse, and the camcorder from the computer.

You cannot view the still images recorded on a "Memory Stick Duo" on the computer.

- · Insert the "Memory Stick Duo" firmly.
- When you connect your camcorder to a computer by selecting [COMPUTER], you cannot view the still images stored in a "Memory Stick Duo." Make sure that you have connected the camcorder to the computer with [COMPUTER].

 The computer does not recognize the "Memory Stick Duo" during cancorder operation such as playback or editing of images on the hard disk. Finish camcorder operation before connecting the camcorder to the computer.

The "Memory Stick" icon ([Removable Disk]) does not appear on the computer screen.

- Insert a "Memory Stick Duo" into your camcorder.
- Disconnect the USB device other than the keyboard, the mouse, and the camcorder from the computer.
- The computer does not recognize the "Memory Stick Duo" during camcorder operation such as playback or editing of images on the hard disk. Finish camcorder operation before connecting the camcorder to the computer.

Picture Motion Browser does not function correctly.

• Close Picture Motion Browser, then restart the Windows computer.

The image or sound recorded on the camcorder is not played on the computer correctly.

- If your camcorder is connect to a computer that does not support Hi-speed USB (USB 2.0), the movie/still image or sound may not be played back correctly. The movie/ still image or sound imported to your computer is not affected.
- Movie playback or sound may stop temporarily depending on your computer. The movie or sound imported to your computer is not affected.

The playback screen is paused or distorted.

• Check the recommended computer environment required to play movies.

The actual displayed screen or message is different from that shown in this Handbook.

• The screen or message may be different.

The extension of a file is not displayed on your computer.

- To display the extension, follow the steps below:
 - Click [Tool] in the window folder → [Folder option...] → [View] tab.
 - ② Remove the check mark from the [Hide file extensions for known file types] under Advanced Settings.
 - 3 Click [OK].

While performing Easy PC Back-up, [Not enough space on destination hard disk.] is displayed on the computer screen.

• Delete unnecessary files from your computer to free hard disk space.

- The hard disk of the camcorder is fully recorded.
- An error may have occurred with the hard disk drive in your camcorder.

C (Battery level warning)

Slow flashing

- The battery pack is nearly used up.
- Depending on the operating environment or battery conditions, may flash, even if there are approximately 20 minutes remaining.

[1] (High temperature warning)

Slow flashing

• The temperature of your camcorder is getting higher. Turn off your camcorder and leave it for a while in a cool place.

• The temperature of your camcorder is extremely high. Turn off your camcorder and leave it for a while in a cool place.

• The temperature of your camcorder is extremely low. Make the camcorder warm.

• No "Memory Stick Duo" is inserted (p. 27).

(Warning indicators pertaining to "Memory Stick Duo" formatting)*

- The "Memory Stick Duo" is damaged.
- The "Memory Stick Duo" is not formatted correctly (p. 50, 111).

(Warning indicator pertaining to incompatible "Memory Stick Duo")*

• An incompatible "Memory Stick Duo" is inserted (p. 111).

- The write-protect tab on the "Memory Stick Duo" is set to lock (p. 111).
- Access to the "Memory Stick Duo" was restricted on another device.

4 (Warning indicator pertaining to the flash)

Fast flashing

• There is something wrong with the flash.

(Warning indicator pertaining to camera-shake warning)

- The amount of lights is not sufficient, so camera-shake easily occurs. Use the flash.
- The camcorder is unsteady, so camerashake easily occurs. Hold the camcorder steady with both hands and shoot the image. However, note that the camera-shake warning indicator does not disappear.

(Warning indicator pertaining to drop sensor)

- The drop sensor function (p. 64) is activated, and has detected that the camcorder has been dropped. Therefore, the camcorder is taking steps to protect the hard disk. Recording/playback may be disabled as a result.
- The drop sensor function does not guarantee the protection of the hard disk under all possible situations. Use the camcorder under stable conditions.

* You hear a melody when the warning indicators appear on the screen (p. 61).

Description of warning messages

If messages appear on the screen, follow the instructions.

🔳 Hard disk

Movie folder full. Cannot record movies.

• Delete unnecessary images (p. 38) or perform [FORMAT] (p. 49).

HDD format error.

 The hard disk of the camcorder is set differently from the default format.
 Performing [FORMAT] (p. 49) may enable you to use your camcorder.
 This will delete all data in the hard disk.

Data error.

• An error occurred during reading or writing the hard disk of the camcorder. This may occur when you keep applying shock on the camcorder.

Management file damaged. Create new file?

 The image management file is damaged. When you touch [YES], a new image management file is created. The old recorded images on the hard disk of the camcorder cannot be played back. (Image files are not damaged.) In this case, import the image files to computer using the supplied software. See page 81 for details.

Buffer overflow

 You cannot record because the drop sensor senses a drop of the camcorder repeatedly. If you may be at risk of dropping the camcorder constantly, set [DROP SENSOR] to [OFF], and you may be able to record the image again (p. 64).

Recovering data

 Your camcorder tries to recover data automatically if the data writing was not performed properly.

Cannot recover data.

• Writing data onto the hard disk of the camcorder has failed. Attempts were made to recover the data, but they were unsuccessful.

"Memory Stick Duo"

3 Reinsert the Memory Stick.

 Reinsert the "Memory Stick Duo" a few times. If even then the indicator flashes, the "Memory Stick Duo" could be damaged. Try with another "Memory Stick Duo."

This Memory Stick is not formatted correctly.

• Check the format, then format the "Memory Stick Duo" with your camcorder if necessary (p. 50).

Memory Stick folders are full.

- You cannot create folders exceeding 999MSDCF. You cannot create or delete created folders using your camcorder.
- You will have to format the "Memory Stick Duo" (p. 50), or delete them using your computer.

Cannot save still picture.

 When using the Dual Rec function, do not remove the still image recording media from the camcorder until recording is finished and still image recording is complete (p. 26).

PictBridge compliant printer

Not connected to PictBridge compatible printer.

• Turn off the printer and on again, then remove the USB cable (supplied) and reconnect it.

Cannot print. Check the printer.

• Turn off the printer and on again, then remove the USB cable (supplied) and reconnect it.

Other

No further selection is possible.

- You can select only 100 images at one time for:
 - -deleting images
 - printing still images

Data protected.

• You tried to delete data protected on another device. Release the protection of the data on the device used to protect the data.

Cannot divide.

• You cannot divided a movie that is extremely short.

Power supply

You can use your camcorder in any countries/regions using the AC Adaptor supplied with your camcorder within the AC 100 V to 240 V, 50/60 Hz range. Use a commercially available AC plug adaptor [a], if necessary, depending on the design of the wall outlet [b].





Files on the camcorder hard disk/folder structure

The file/folder structure is shown below. You do not usually need to acknowledge the file/ folder structure, when recording/playing back images on the camcorder. To enjoy still images or movies by connecting to a computer, see page 73, then use the supplied application.



1 Image management files

When you delete the files, you cannot record/play back the images correctly. The files are defaulted as hidden files and not usually displayed.

2 Movie files (MPEG2 files)

The extension of the files is ".MPG". The maximum size is 2 GB. When the capacity of a file exceeds 2 GB, the file becomes divided.

The file numbers go up automatically. When the file numbers exceeds 9,999, another folder is created to record new movie files.

The folder name goes up: [101PNV01] \rightarrow [102PNV01]

3 Still image files (JPEG files)

The extension of the files is ".JPG". The file numbers go up automatically. When the capacity of a file number exceeds 9,999, another folder is created to store new image files.

The folder name goes up: [101MSDCF] \rightarrow [102MSDCF]

 By selecting [OCOMPUTER] on [USB SELECT], you can access the hard disk of the camcorder from the computer through USB connection.

- Do not modify the files or folders on the cancorder through the computer without using the supplied computer application. The image files may be destroyed or may not be played back.
- Operation is not guaranteed, if you perform the above operation without using the supplied computer application.
- Do not format the hard disk of the camcorder using the computer. The camcorder may not operate correctly.
- When the file extensions are not displayed on the computer screen, see page 102.
- Do not copy the files on the hard disk of the camcorder from the computer. Operation is not guaranteed.
- When the folder number shows 999 and file number exceeds 9,999, recording may not be possible. In this case, perform [O FORMAT] (p. 49).

Maintenance and precautions

About the "Memory Stick"

A "Memory Stick" is a compact, portable IC recording medium with a large data capacity.

However, we do not guarantee the operation of all types of "Memory Stick Duo" on your camcorder. (See the list below for more details.)

*1 A "Memory Stick Duo" is about half the size of a standard "Memory Stick."

- *2 The types of "Memory Stick" that support high speed data transfer. The speed of data transfer varies depending on the device to be used.
- *3 "MagicGate" is a copyright protection technology that records and transfers the contents in an encrypted format. Note that data that uses "MagicGate" technology cannot be recorded or played on your camcorder.
- Still image format: Your camcorder compresses and records image data in the JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) format. The file extension is ".JPG."
- File names of still images:
 - 101-0001: This file name appears on the screen of your camcorder.
 - DSC00001.JPG: This file name appears on the display of a computer.
- A "Memory Stick Duo" formatted by a computer (Windows OS/Mac OS) does not have guaranteed compatibility with your camcorder.

• Data read/write speed may vary depending on the combination of the "Memory Stick" and "Memory Stick" compliant product you use.

On a "Memory Stick Duo" with a write-protect tab

You can prevent accidental erasure of images when you slide the write-protect tab on the "Memory Stick Duo" with a small tapered object, to the write-protect position.

Notes on use

Damaged or lost image data will not be compensated for, and may occur in the following cases:

- If you eject the "Memory Stick Duo," turn the power off on your camcorder, or remove the battery pack for replacement while your camcorder is reading or writing image files on the "Memory Stick Duo" (while the ACCESS lamp is lit or flashing).
- If you use the "Memory Stick Duo" near magnets or magnetic fields.

It is recommended you make a back-up of important data on the hard disk of a computer.

On handling a "Memory Stick"

Keep the following in mind when handling a "Memory Stick Duo."

- Be careful not to apply excessive force when writing on a memo area on a "Memory Stick Duo."
- Do not attach a label or the like on a "Memory Stick Duo" or a Memory Stick Duo adaptor.
- When you carry or store a "Memory Stick Duo," put it in its case.
- Do not touch, or allow metallic objects to come into contact with the terminals.
- Do not bend, drop or apply strong force to the "Memory Stick Duo."
- Do not disassemble or modify the "Memory Stick Duo."
- Do not let the "Memory Stick Duo" get wet.
- Be careful to keep "Memory Stick Duo" media out of the reach of small children. There is danger that a child might swallow it.

• Do not insert anything other than a "Memory Stick Duo" into the "Memory Stick Duo" slot. Doing so may cause a malfunction.

On a location for use

Do not use or keep the "Memory Stick Duo" in the following locations:

- Places subject to extremely high temperature, such as a car parked outside in the summer.
- · Places under direct sunlight.
- Places with extremely high humidity or subject to corrosive gases.

On the Memory Stick Duo adaptor

After inserting a "Memory Stick Duo" into the Memory Stick Duo adaptor, you can use it with a standard "Memory Stick" compliant device.

- When using a "Memory Stick Duo" with a "Memory Stick" compliant device, be sure to insert the "Memory Stick Duo" into a Memory Stick Duo adaptor.
- When inserting a "Memory Stick Duo" into a Memory Stick Duo adaptor, make sure the "Memory Stick Duo" is inserted facing in the correct direction, then insert it all the way in. Note that improper use may cause a malfunction. Also, if you force the "Memory Stick Duo" into the Memory Stick Duo adaptor in the wrong direction, it may be damaged.
- Do not insert a Memory Stick Duo adaptor without a "Memory Stick Duo" attached. Doing so may result in malfunctions of the unit.

On a "Memory Stick PRO Duo"

The maximum memory capacity of a "Memory Stick PRO Duo" that can be used on your camcorder is 4 GB.

On image data compatibility

- Image data files recorded on a "Memory Stick Duo" by your camcorder conform to the "Design rule for Camera File system" universal standard established by the JEITA (Japan Electronics and Information Technology Industries Association).
- On your camcorder, you cannot play back still images recorded on other devices (DCR-TRV900E or DSC-D700/D770) that do not conform to the universal standard. (These models are not sold in some regions.)

- If you cannot use a "Memory Stick Duo" that has been used with another device, format it with your camcorder (p. 50). Note that formatting erases all information on the "Memory Stick Duo."
- You may not be able to play back images with your camcorder:
 - When playing back image data modified on your computer.
 - When playing back image data recorded with other devices.

About the "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack

Your camcorder operates only with an "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack (H series). "InfoLITHIUM" H series battery packs have the mark.

What is an "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack?

An "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack is a lithium-ion battery pack that has functions for communicating information related to operating conditions between your camcorder and an optional AC Adaptor/ charger.

The "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack calculates the power consumption according to the operating conditions of your camcorder, and displays the remaining battery time in minutes.

With an AC Adaptor/charger, the remaining battery time and charging time appear.

To charge the battery pack

- Be sure to charge the battery pack before you start using your camcorder.
- We recommend charging the battery pack in an ambient temperature of between 10 °C to 30 °C (50 °F to 86 °F) until the CHG (charge) lamp turns off. If you charge the battery pack outside of this temperature range, you may not be able to charge it efficiently.
- After charging is complete, disconnect the cable from the DC IN jack on the Handycam Station or your camcorder, then remove the battery pack.

To use the battery pack effectively

- Battery pack performance decreases when the surrounding temperature is 10 °C (50 °F) or below, and the length of time you can use the battery pack becomes shorter. In that case, do one of the following to use the battery pack for a longer time.
 - Put the battery pack in a pocket to warm it up, and insert it in your camcorder right before you start taking shots.
 - Use a large capacity battery pack: NP-FH70/ FH100 (optional).
- Frequent use of the LCD screen or a frequent playback, fast forward or rewind operation wears out the battery pack faster.
 We recommend using a large capacity battery pack: NP-FH70/FH100.
- Be sure to set the POWER switch to OFF (CHG) when not recording or playing back on your camcorder. The battery pack is also consumed when your camcorder is in recording standby or playback pause.
- Have spare battery packs ready for two or three times the expected recording time, and make trial recordings before making the actual recording.
- Do not expose the battery pack to water. The battery pack is not water resistant.

About the remaining battery time indicator

- When the power goes off even though the remaining battery time indicator indicates that the battery pack has enough power to operate, charge the battery pack fully again. Remaining battery time will be indicated correctly. Note, however, that the battery indication will not be restored if it is used in high temperatures for a long time, or if left in a fully charged state, or when the battery pack is frequently used. Use the remaining battery time indication as a rough guide only.
- The \Box mark that indicates low battery flashes even if there are still 5 to 10 minutes of battery time remaining, depending on the operating conditions or ambient temperature.

About storage of the battery pack

- If the battery pack is not used for a long time, fully charge the battery pack and use it up on your camcorder once a year to maintain proper function. To store the battery pack, remove it from your camcorder and put it in a dry, cool place.
- To discharge the battery pack on your camcorder completely, touch (SETTINGS) → [GENERAL SET] → [A.SHUT OFF] → [NEVER] on the HOME MENU and leave your camcorder in recording standby until the power goes off (p. 64).

About battery life

- Battery capacity decreases over time and through repeated use. If decreased usage time between charges becomes significant, it is probably time to replace it with a new one.
- Each battery's life is governed by storage, operating and environmental conditions.

About handling of your camcorder

On use and care

- Do not use or store the camcorder and accessories in the following locations:
 - Anywhere extremely hot, cold or humid. Never leave them exposed to temperatures above 60 °C (140 °F), such as under direct sunlight, near heaters or in a car parked in the sun. They may malfunction or become deformed.
 - Near strong magnetic fields or mechanical vibration. The camcorder may malfunction.
 - Near strong radio waves or radiation. The camcorder may not be able to record properly.
 - Near AM receivers and video equipment. Noise may occur.
 - On a sandy beach or anywhere dusty. If sand or dust gets in your camcorder, it may malfunction. Sometimes this malfunction cannot be repaired.
 - Near windows or outdoors, where the LCD screen or the lens may be exposed to direct sunlight. This damages the inside of the LCD screen.
- Operate your camcorder on DC 6.8 V/7.2 V (battery pack) or DC 8.4 V (AC Adaptor).
- For DC or AC operation, use the accessories recommended in these operating instructions.
- Do not let your camcorder get wet, for example, from rain or sea water. If your camcorder gets wet, it may malfunction. Sometimes this malfunction cannot be repaired.
- If any solid object or liquid gets inside the casing, unplug your camcorder and have it checked by a Sony dealer before operating it any further.
- Avoid rough handling, disassembling, modifying, physical shock, or impact such as hammering, dropping or stepping on the product. Be particularly careful of the lens.
- Keep the POWER switch setting to OFF (CHG) when you are not using your camcorder.
- Do not wrap your camcorder with a towel, for example, and operate it. Doing so might cause heat to build up inside.
- When disconnecting the power cord, pull it by the plug and not the cord.

- Do not damage the power cord such as by placing anything heavy on it.
- · Keep metal contacts clean.
- Keep the Remote Commander and button-type battery out of children's reach. If the battery is accidentally swallowed, consult a doctor immediately (DCR-SR62/SR82/SR200/SR300).
- · If the battery electrolytic liquid has leaked:
 - consult your local authorized Sony service facility.
 - wash off any liquid that may have contacted your skin.
 - if any liquid gets in your eyes, wash with plenty of water and consult a doctor.

When not using your camcorder for a long time

- Periodically turn it on and let it run such as by playing back or recording images for about 3 minutes.
- Use up the battery pack completely before storing it.

Moisture condensation

If your camcorder is brought directly from a cold place to a warm place, moisture may condense inside your camcorder. This may cause a malfunction to your camcorder.

■ If moisture condensation has occurred Leave your camcorder for about 1 hour

without turning it on.

Note on moisture condensation

Moisture may condense when you bring your camcorder from a cold place into a warm place (or vice versa) or when you use your camcorder in a humid place as follows:

- You bring your camcorder from a ski slope into a place warmed up by a heating device.
- You bring your camcorder from an air conditioned car or room into a hot place outside.
- You use your camcorder after a squall or a shower.
- You use your camcorder in a hot and humid place.

How to prevent moisture condensation

When you bring your camcorder from a cold place into a warm place, put your camcorder in a plastic bag and seal it tightly. Remove the bag when the air temperature inside the plastic bag has reached the surrounding temperature (after about 1 hour).

LCD screen

- Do not exert excessive pressure on the LCD screen, as it may cause damage.
- If your camcorder is used in a cold place, a residual image may appear on the LCD screen. This is not a malfunction.
- While using your camcorder, the back of the LCD screen may heat up. This is not a malfunction.

To clean the LCD screen

If fingerprints or dust make the LCD screen dirty, it is recommended you use a soft cloth to clean it. When you use the LCD Cleaning Kit (optional), do not apply the cleaning liquid directly to the LCD screen. Use cleaning paper moistened with the liquid.

On adjustment of the touch panel (CALIBRATION)

The buttons on the touch panel may not work correctly. If this happens, follow the procedure below. It is recommended that you connect your camcorder to the wall outlet using the supplied AC Adaptor during the operation.

- Turn on your camcorder, then press
 (HOME).
- (2) Touch rightarrow (SETTINGS) \rightarrow [GENERAL SET] \rightarrow [CALIBRATION].



③ Touch "×" displayed on the screen with the corner of the "Memory Stick Duo" or the like. The position of "×" changes. Touch [CANCEL] to cancel.

If you did not press the right spot, try the calibration again.

Ø Notes

- Do not use a sharp-pointed object for calibration. Doing so may damage the LCD screen.
- You cannot calibrate the LCD screen if it is rotated, or closed with the screen facing out.

On handling the casing

- If the casing is soiled, clean the camcorder body with a soft cloth lightly moistened with water, and then wipe the casing with a dry soft cloth.
- Avoid the following to avoid damage to the finish:
 - Using chemicals such as thinner, benzine, alcohol, chemical cloths, repellent, insecticide and sunscreen.
 - Handling the camcorder with above substances on your hands.
 - Leaving the casing in contact with rubber or vinyl objects for a long period of time.

About care and storage of the lens

- Wipe the surface of the lens clean with a soft cloth in the following instances:
 - When there are fingerprints on the lens surface.
 - In hot or humid locations
 - When the lens is exposed to salty air such as at the seaside.
- Store in a well-ventilated location subject to little dirt or dust.
- To prevent mold, periodically clean the lens as described above. It is recommended that you operate your camcorder about once a month to keep it in optimum state for a long time.

On charging the pre-installed rechargeable battery

Your camcorder has a pre-installed rechargeable battery to retain the date, time, and other settings even when the POWER switch is set to OFF (CHG). The preinstalled rechargeable battery is always charged while your camcorder is connected to the wall outlet via the AC Adaptor or while the battery pack is attached. The rechargeable battery will be fully discharged in about **3 months** if you do not use your camcorder at all. Use your camcorder after charging the pre-installed rechargeable battery.

However, even if the pre-installed rechargeable battery is not charged, the camcorder operation will not be affected as long as you are not recording the date.

Procedures

Connect your camcorder to a wall outlet using the supplied AC Adaptor, and leave it with the POWER switch set to OFF (CHG) for more than 24 hours.


The Active Interface Shoe has a safety device for fixing the installed accessory securely. To connect an accessory, press down and push it to the end, and then tighten the screw. To remove an accessory, loosen the screw, and then press down and pull out the accessory.

- When you are recording movies with an external flash (optional) connected to the accessory shoe, turn off the power of the external flash to prevent charging noise being recorded.
- You cannot use an external flash (optional) and the built-in flash at the same time.
- When an external microphone (optional) is connected, it takes precedence over the built-in microphone (p. 25).

Data code during recording

The recording date and time is recorded automatically on the hard disk and "Memory Stick Duo." They are not displayed while recording. However, you can check them as [DATA CODE] during playback (p. 60).

Glossary

5.1ch surround sound

A system that plays back sound on 6 speakers, 3 at the front (left, right and center) and 2 at the rear (right and left) with an additional low-pass subwoofer counted as a 0.1 channel for frequencies of 120 Hz or lower.

Dolby Digital

An audio encoding (compression) system developed by Dolby Laboratories Inc.

Dolby Digital 5.1 Creator

Sound compression technology developed by Dolby Laboratories Inc. which compresses audio efficiently while preserving high sound quality. It enables recording of 5.1ch surround sound while using hard disk space more efficiently. DVDs created by Dolby Digital 5.1 Creator can be played back on a compatible DVD device. You can enjoy more realistic sound by playing the movie on the device that supports 5.1ch surround sound.

Fragmentation

The condition of a hard disk in which files are divided into pieces scattered around the hard disk. You may not save your images correctly. You can solve the condition by performing $[\bigcirc FORMAT]$ (p. 49).

JPEG

JPEG stands for Joint Photographic Experts Group, a still image data compression (data capacity reduction) standard. Your camcorder records still images in JPEG format.

MPEG

MPEG stands for Moving Picture Experts Group, the group of standards for the coding (image compression) of video (movie) and audio. There are MPEG1 and MPEG2 formats. Your camcorder records movies with SD (standard definition) image quality in MPEG2 format.

Thumbnail

Reduced-size images which enable you to view many images at the same time. "VISUAL INDEX" use a thumbnail display system.

VBR

VBR stands for Variable Bit Rate, the recording format for automatically controlling the bit rate (the volume of recording data in a given time segment) according to the scene being recorded. For fast-moving video, a lot of hard disk space is used to produce a clear image, so the recording time to the hard disk shortens.

VISUAL INDEX

This function displays images of movies and still images you have recorded so that you can select those scenes you want to play back.
